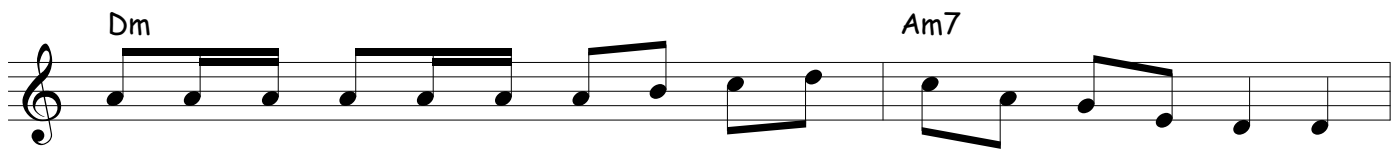


DRUNKEN SAILOR

Traditional Irish song



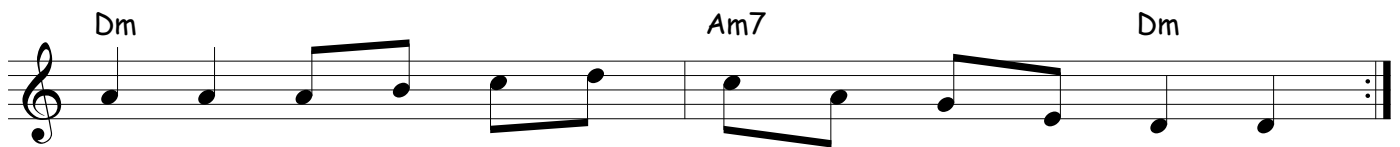
What shall we do with a drun-ken sai-lor? what shall we do with a drun-ken sai-lor?
